To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow early childhood educators to take the educator expense deduction, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Supporting Early-
5 childhood Educators’ Deductions Act of 2025” or the
6 “SEED Act of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. EDUCATOR EXPENSE DEDUCTION TO INCLUDE**
2 **EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATORS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 62 of the Internal Rev-
4 enue Code of 1986 is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a)(2)(D), by striking the
6 heading and inserting “CERTAIN EXPENSES OF
7 EARLY CHILDHOOD, ELEMENTARY, AND SECONDARY
8 SCHOOL TEACHERS.”;

9 (2) in subsection (d)(1)(A), by striking “kinder-
10 garten through grade 12 teacher” and inserting,
11 “early childhood educator, kindergarten through
12 grade 12 teacher”; and

13 (3) in subsection (d)(1)(B), by striking “ele-
14 mentary education or secondary education (kinder-
15 garten through grade 12)” and inserting, “early
16 childhood education, elementary education, or sec-
17 ondary education (pre-kindergarten through grade
18 12)”.

19 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
20 this section shall apply to expenses incurred in taxable
21 years beginning after December 31, 2024.
